

## **THE HOLY YEAR: JUBILEE 2025**



As you may know, the Holy Father, Pope Francis has appointed 2025 to be a Holy Year, a Jubilee Year, when - based on the ancient Old Testament practice of Jubilees every 50 years - the Church celebrates a Jubilee every 25 years, or else on extraordinary occasions, such as in 2016, when the Holy Father called for a Year of Mercy, outside of the 25 and 50 year customs. The goal of a Jubilee from the Scriptures was a renewal of devotion and faithfulness to God and His Covenant, the forgiveness of sins and the cancelation of debt. You may remember the latter from the Jubilee for the Millennium in 2000. It will be important for us as a parish to mark the Holy Year, and I would principally want this to be a year of spiritual renewal for each of us through three basic and yet significant commitments:

- 1. Prayer every day
- 2. Mass every week
- 3. Confession every month

To pray at least once a day - but everyday, no matter how briefly; to attend Mass every week despite how busy our family and work commitments might be; to make a good Confession of our sins every month - these three simple steps could radically transform our parish, if we each made the decision to take up these three spiritual responsibilities beginning 1 January, 2025

To that end, I will share with the parish some more information in the coming weeks in the lead up to the New Year that to mark the beginning of the Holy Year, we will have Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament on New Year's Eve and Mass on New Year's Day, when I will invite parishioners to sign up to this spiritual covenant to make 2025 a truly Holy Year. Please consider whether you might commit to these three steps to sanctifying 2025 and to help the conversion of our parish.



#### **Friends of the Holy Land Appeal**


Kath Keegan from the Parish Justice and Peace Group writes: Usually at this time of year the Justice & Peace Group is appealing for members of our parishes to sign Christmas cards for the Holy Land but this year it is different due to the massive problems for Christians there. The Justice & Peace Group will send one Christmas greeting card to each of one of the nineteen parishes and organisations including Gaza, the West Bank, East Jerusalem and for the first time in a number of years parishes in Israel proper including Nazareth.

There are two reasons for this one is that the Liverpool Archdiocese have requested this because of conditions in Israel and also the high cost of postage.

This weekend Fr Edmund has kindly agreed to a second collection for the Friends of the Holy Land to help in their work for the Christian communities over the Masses of 23/24 November. Due to the conditions there are no pilgrims or visitors to East Jerusalem or Bethlehem and the West Bank so there is a great deal of hardship. In Gaza all the Christians are sheltering at the Holy Family Church in Gaza City and Fr Romanelli, who was out of Gaza last October was able to rejoin his people as he was part of an official delegation. #### **Assisted Suicide Bill: Vote in Parliament**

I received an appeal from the Bishop's Office that I share with you. Bishop Mark has been contacted by the Director of Operations at 'Right to Life' regarding the disability campaign group Not Dead Yet UK, who are a network of people with disabilities who oppose assisted suicide. Last weekend postcards from Not Dead Yet UK have been delivered to every Catholic church in the country. Parishioners can use these to easily contact their MP to encourage them to vote against assisted suicide and I encourage you do to so. Bishop Mark asks that I distribute these cards to you and to encourage you to send a postcard to our MPs in good time before the vote on 29 November.

#### **Special Mass of the Holy Spirit**

I will to offer a Votive Mass of the Holy Spirit on Friday at 7.30am at Our Lady Star of the Sea Church ahead of the day's debate and vote in the House of Commons, asking that the Holy Spirit guide the exchange and the outcome of the vote. This moral issue is urgent and we have a spiritual duty to pray that this Bill is defeated. I have arranged the Holy Mass for 7.30am to make it possible for many to attend: working people, children and young people, our teachers and school staff, our retired and those heading off to work might make a special effort to come to Mass that morning to unite in prayer to safeguard the most vulnerable.

### ST ANDREW, PATRON OF SCOTLAND

This coming Saturday is the feast of the patron saint of Scotland, St Andrew. Andrew was the first of the Twelve Apostles to be called and he was the one who brought Simon (later, Peter) to Jesus, telling his brother, *We have found the Messiah!* Andrew is therefore given the title *The First-Called* and traditionally the Patriarch of Constantinople was regarded as the successor to St Andrew in a similar way to how we believe the pope to be the successor of Peter. Andrew became Scotland's patron when his relics were carried to the town that bears his name: St Andrews.
